All which are given by inspiration of God, to be the rule of faith and life. III. The books commonly called Apocrypha, not being of divine inspiration, are no part of the Canon of Scripture; and therefore are of no authority in the Church of God, nor to be any otherwise approved, or made use of, than other human writings.

THE WESTMINSTER CONFESSION OF FAITH (1646)

1. THE WORD OF GOD: We believe and confess that the Bible is the verbally inspired Word of God. It is the only rule for faith and practice. The Word of God, especially the New Testament, is the standard by which the Christian orders his life.
