In the past, the technical possibilities of road pricing were very limited [15] but with the advent of electronic road pricing, cars no longer have to stop to be charged.

Rationales for Pricing . Roadway congestion, air pollution from cars, and the lack of resources to finance new surface transportation options present challenges. Road pricing, charging users a monetary toll in addition to the amount of time spent traveling, has been suggested as a solution to these problems.
